

The best idea is to climb to the top very early in the morning, in order to watch the sun rise over lake Geneva.

From the Planchamp col, head back down through the alpine pastures, and back to the Col de Corber by the forestry track.

4th Section

Did you enjoy this walk?

Choose « At the foot of the Roc d'Enfer »

When leaving the Nicodex Col, follow the path on the right, direction Col de Planchamp. This footpath joins a forestry path that leads all the way to the Ouzon Derrière chalets, and the Planchamp Col.

3rd Section

Variation of Mont Ouzon

At the Planchamp Col, take the path that starts just behind the chalet, which climbs steadily through the fields. As you reach the last few metres of the itinerary, take the route with the safety chain, to help you climb over the rocks. At the summit, you'll find an exceptional panoramic view of the Chablais summits.

stream runs through a broad-leaved forest, quite rare in this region (beach and silver birch).

2d Section

The path starts to climb again along an open crest, from which there's a view of the entire Aulps valley, lake Geneva and even Mont Blanc. Take the path through the forest that crosses a number of corridors (view of the Joty dam), then continue until the Nicodex Col. At the Col, you can walk down to the chalets situated below you, where there's drinking water.

Start from the Col de Corbier, in front of the hotel. Walk up the tarmac road to L'Ar-blay, then take the forest path. This path snakes its way up and down to the Pas de l'Ours (bear's paw prints). The story goes that a bear was seen here last century, but in fact the word "pas" comes from "passage" and "l'ours" from the Indo-European word "or" meaning rock.

There is actually a passage through the rocks much higher than the cliff...but no bear tracks! Under the Pas de l'Ours cliff, there's a difficult part with safety ladders taking you down to the Tire valley. The
