**The Tréchauffé alpine pastures**  
 These 50 ha of woods and alpine pastures constitute a real wild nature area where was recently built a farm goat. Goat cheese is made here, and you're free to visit the farm or to have a meal at the restaurant of the farm.



**Goats**

The Tréchauffé goats are real alpine goats from the "chamoisée" breed. They produce an extremely plain milk which is transformed into cheese right after the

**Chalets in the alpine pasture**  
 The architecture is typical from the Chablais: the lowest part of the building is made of stone. The rest of it is built of wood. In the past, families used to stay in these chalets during 5 or 6 months to allow goats and cows to stay peacefully in the pasture.

- Quite easy (aerial parts at the top of the peak)
- very nice weather
- Carpark at the « Col de Tréchauffé » (La Forclaz)
- 400 m

- mountain chalets, goat farm and view over Lake Geneva



It's definitely worth climbing up to the Tréchauffé's Peak as there's a breathtaking view: Lake Geneva, the Jura mountains, the lower part of the Vallée d'Aulps (La Vernaz and the Mévoune cliffs).

Take the path to join the Col de Nico-dex (1436m) in about 45 minutes. There, the Poizat alpine pastures is still occupied by local cows.



Follow the sign (direction Col de Tréchauffé) to join the car park by taking firstly the forestry road and secondly a small path in the woods.

Park your car at the Tréchauffé Col, next to the goat's farm (6 km from La Forclaz village).



From the car park, take the path located about 300m behind you (on the right). It snakes its way up and down through the alpine pasture and to the Col de l'Aiguille (1400m). Then, it crosses the forest. Take the safety metal stairs to reach the top of the mountain. When arriving at the top, you can leave the path to climb up, by going on your right, to the top of the Tréchauffé's Peak
